Copyright Guidelines

Guidelines for Print and Internet Material

- * <u>Single copies</u> of the following may be made for scholarly research or teaching or preparation to teach a class:
 - a chapter of a book,
 - -an article from a periodical or newspaper
 - -a story, essay, or poem that is short
 - -a chart, picture, graph, or diagram from a book, periodical, or newspaper.
- * <u>Multiple copies</u>, **not to exceed one per pupil**, for classroom use may only be made if the conditions of **spontaneity** (there is no time to obtain permission from the author) and **brevity** are meet. **Each copy must include a notice of copyright.**

Under the **brevity** conditions copies may be made of:

- -a poem of less than 250 words
- -an excerpt of less than 250 words from a long poem
- -a story, essay or article of less than 2500 words
- -an excerpt from any prose work of not more than 1000 words or 10% of the entire work, whichever is less
- * The reproduction of consumable copyrighted workbooks is specifically PROHIBITED.
- * The reproduction of syndicated copyrighted comic strip characters is prohibited.

Guidelines for computer software

- * One copy may be made of copyrighted (purchased) software for backup (archival copy). The backup disk may be used as a replacement if the original is damaged, but may not be used to generate more copies or as an additional copy of the original.
- * Multiple copies may NOT be made unless you have a license from the company to do so.
- * Software may not be loaded onto multiple computers unless you have a license to do so.
- * Freeware (public domain) software may be copied.

Guidelines for Music

- * Sheet music may be copied under emergency provisions of an imminent performance only if copies are on order.
- * Copying musical selections from radio, or audio tape for use in classrooms is not permissible.

Guidelines for Video

All school use of videos must follow Fair Use Guidelines

Fair Use Guidelines state that the video must be shown:

- -as part of the instructional program, NOT for extra-curricular recreation, entertainment or intellectual or cultural value;
- -by instructors;
- -in a classroom or other location devoted to instruction, NOT in an auditorium or stadium:
- -in a face-to-face setting where teachers and students are in the same area;
- -only to students;
- -using a legitimate copy

<u>Instructional Television (ITV)</u> - All rights for the programs in the ITV Guide been obtained by WCVE/WCVW/WHTJ and cleared for use by teachers in a classroom/instructional setting.

- * ITV programs may be recorded by teachers, librarians, parents, etc.
- * You may record these programs at school, home, etc.
- * Programs may be retained on tape as long as the program appears in the ITV Guide.
- * Retained programs may be shown as many times and by as many teachers as would like to use it.
- * ITV programs may be transmitted from a division media center or other system over an in-school closed circuit system.

Guidelines for Non ITV Programs

- * Request the librarian to tape all programs not included if the ITV guide schedule; NO personal recordings may be made at home and brought to school.
- * No taping can be made from subscription television channels (HBO, Showtime, Disney, The Movie Channel, etc.)
- * Use the program only twice in the following ten school days; review and evaluate for next 35 calendar days and erase 45 days after taping if retention rights have not been secured.
- * Programs must be shown following Fair Use Guidelines

Guidelines for Video Rentals

- * The rental agent knows and approves (documentation) of the tape being used in a school for instructional purposes.
- * A "home use only" agreement has NOT been signed.
- * The tape is used only for one class not distributed over closed circuit to a large audience.
- * The tape must be shown following Fair Use Guidelines
- * No fee can be charged for viewing.

* The warning label "For home use only" must NOT be shown in the classroom.

Guidelines for Video purchased by the school

- * Must be purchased from an educational distributor NOT consumer shops or wholesale clubs.
- * The distributor has documentation that the tape is for school use(on order).
- * The school has documentation on file from the distributor that includes an exemption from the copyright warnings on the tape ("for home use only")
- o The tape must be shown following Fair Use Guidelines.
